INTRODUCTION

DURING the crusades, and for a number of years afterward, many families in Europe put the prefix St. to their names in order to indicate that they had taken part in these holy wars. This seems to have been the case with the Ivey family. Many of these families went over to England after the Norman conquest and we find St. Ivo and St. Ives in a number of counties. There is documentary evidence that Ivo, Ivey, Ivi, Ivy Ivie and Ivey are all of the same family. At a time when there were no dictionaries, the art of spelling was not highly developed. Sir Walter Raleigh spelled his name a dozen different ways, and the father of the writer spelled his name Ivy until about 1880, since which time all his children have spelled it Ivey. However, both his grandfather Benjamin and his great-grandfather Adam, spelled their names IVEY.

While in some parts of the country the name is unusual, there must be in the aggregate many thousands bearing this name. For instance, Adam Ivey, 1700-1762, had nine children, but we have record of only one, Benjamin who had seven. If his other eight children had large families, it can readily be seen that there are many who are unknown, so far as their descendants are concerned. This is the case of many other families where there were perhaps half a dozen children with only one known to posterity. When the first U. S. census was taken in 1790, there were twelve families in Virginia, as many in South Carolina, and twenty-nine in North Carolina. Outside of these three states only two families are recorded—one in Pennsylvania and one in Maryland.

In the Revolutionary War the names of six soldiers are listed from Virginia and nine from North Carolina. In the Civil War there were hundreds, some of them in almost every Southern state.

This treatise is in no sense of the word a history of the family, but rather a genealogical chart. Abundant material is at hand to write a history, but we will leave this task to other hands. Several tracts have been published, among which we will mention "Colonists of Carolina," by Blanche Humphery Abbe; "Men of the Burning Heart," by Plyler; "William and Mary College Quarterly," Volume 7, by W. Mac Jones, and "The Media Research Report." Many wills, deeds, grants, and other information are available, taken from the records of a score of counties, but many

important records were burned by the northern troops in 1860-1865.

Until about 1800 practically all of the family lived in Eastern North Carolina and Virginia. About this time Benjamin Ivey sold the land he had inherited from his father, Adam Ivey, in Edgecombe County, and settled in Randolph County. There are now many descendants of this family scattered throughout the Piedmont Section of North Carolina.

The oldest home is located near Seven Springs, Wayne County, N. C. It is more than a hundred and twenty-five years old, and is now occupied by Mattie Ivey West, a granddaughter of John Ivy, 1817-1893. To this shrine the eastern branch of the family gathers every year on the second Sunday in July. The fact that in 1940 there were 156 present shows that the family spirit is strong.

WILL OF ADAM IVEY, 1700-1762

IN THE NAME of God Amen; this tenth day of June in the year of Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and sixty-two, I, Adam Ivey of Edgecombe County, being sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God, therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this, my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following.

That is to say first and principally that I give my soul unto the hands of God who gave it me. My body I recommend to the earth to be decently buried in Christianlike manner at the descretion of my executors hereafter named. Without doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God and touching such worldly estate wherefore it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I bequeath in a manner and form following.

Once, it is my will that all just and lawful debts be paid, and funwrell expenses.

I give and bequeath to my son Francis Ivey five shillings of sterling by bearer I have address to him already as much as my ability will afford. Item

I give and bequeath to my son Adam Ivey five shillings of sterling by bearor I have address to him already as much as my ability will afford. Item

I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Ivey one side saddle and one spinning wheel which is called Nern, one box iron and twenty pounds of proclamation money. Item

I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Ivey twenty-five pounds proclamation money. Item

To her and her heirs I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Ivey twenty-five pounds proclamation money to be paid to her at her arriving at the age of twenty-one years. Item

I give and bequeath to my son Lewis Ivey the old plantation that I bought of Wm Register containing two thousand acres of land and one young horse and saddle and all cattle with half moons in a ear and fifty pounds proclamation money to be paid to him at the age of twenty-one years and one rifeld gunn. Item

I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife one side saddle and one spinning wheel which she calls Honoras and one wooling wheel

and six hundred pounds of pork and four hundred wait of beef and ten pounds of Indian Corn. I leave also to my well beloved wife one feather bed and furniture untell my son George comes of age and to be divided to him also. I give the insurance of my dwelling house and as much cleared land unto my son George as he shall tend during five years if no longer. Item

Also I leave to my beloved wife fifty pounds proclamation money untell my son George comes to the age of twenty-one years then thirty pounds to be paid to him and other twenty pounds at her decease to become due to my son George Ivey. Item

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Ivey twenty-five pounds proclamation money to be paid to her at the age of twenty years. Item

I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Ivey the plantation we dwell on containing two hundred eighty-five acres of land and after all this is included the remains of my estate to my son Benjamin Ivey and his heirs forever and of this Will I make constitute, ordain and appoint my well beloved son Benjamin my whole and sole executor, revoking all and annulling all former and other wills by me hereinafter made, ratifying, and confirming this, and no other, this my last Will and Testament.

Witness my hand and seal this the date first above written.

This shall be declared by the said executor to be his last Will and Testament in the presence of us.
