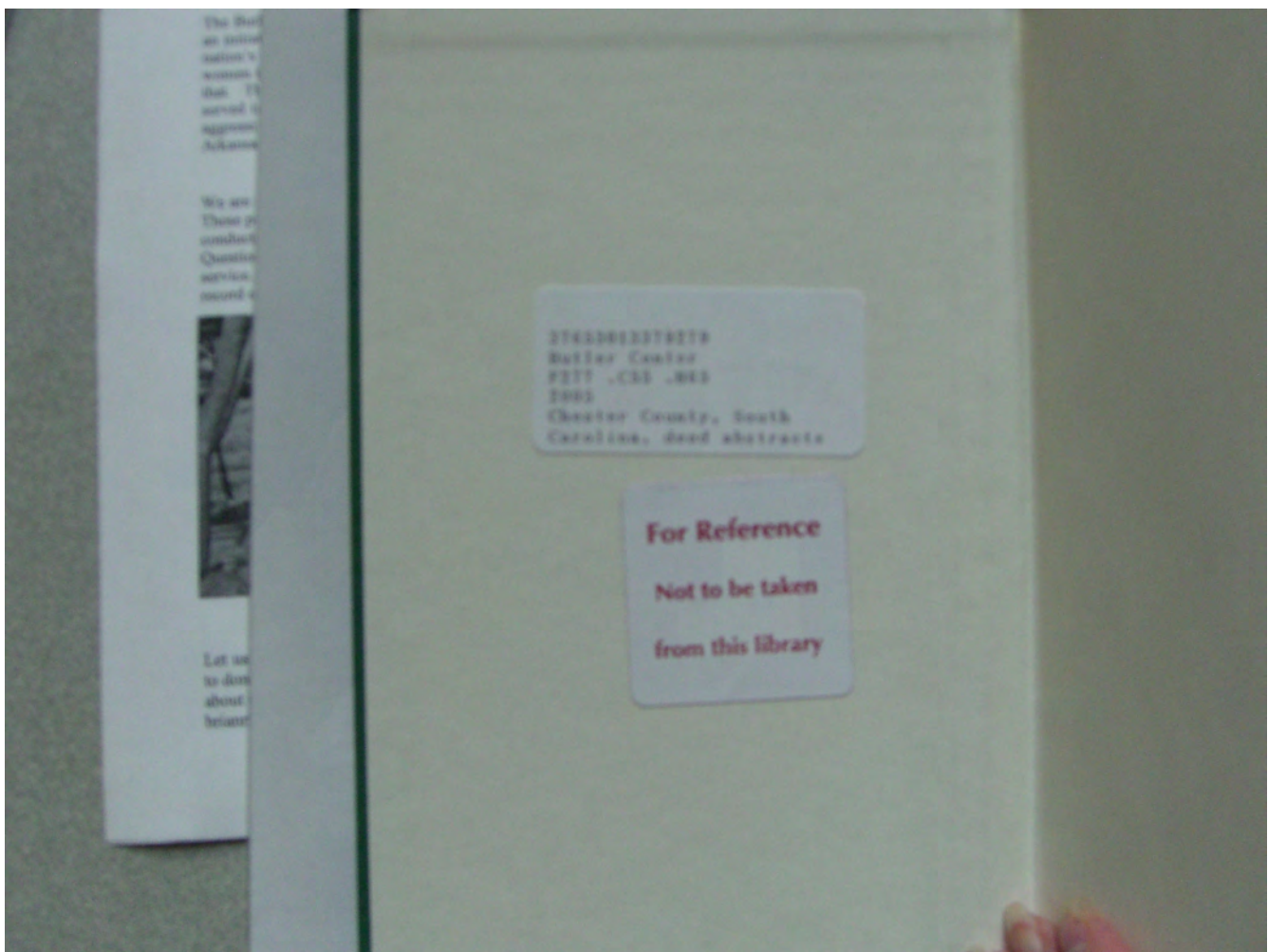

6. 1794-1795. 21 Aug 1794, James Cobb of Union County, NC, to William Reed of Onslow County, for £200 sterling, 100 acres, part of a tract granted 25 Dec 1773 to Richard Waring, 400 acres on a branch of Sandy River called the Catfish Creek lot, John Reed, Heppesham County, Gloucestershire, conveyed to said Waring to David Ford, 1779, recorded in Chancery 24 Aug 1778, in Book V, No. 6, page 167 and 168, and from David Ford to Nathaniel Cobb 16 Nov 1793, James Cobb (decd), Wm John Reed, Adam Williamson, James Taylor (vs).

C. 178-179: South Carolina, District of Columbia, 12 March 1785, John Haskins of Charleston, planter, to Hugh Stuart of same, Charleston, re 21 meadow, 200 acres, part of 400 acres on a branch of Sandy Creek of Broad River, granted 27 Nov 1778 [sic] John Haskins (decd). Wit: James Goo, Richard Evans, John Pratt. Passed in Chester County by the oath of Richard Evans 28 Jan 1784 before Clayton Rogers, JP.

Benjamin Linn, William Martin, dated 24 Sept 1795. David McQuinn (own seal), Wm. Hanna Hamilton, Hugh McQuinn, John Williams. Proved in Chester county by the oath of William McQuinn 24 Sept 1795 before Hanna Hamilton. Recorded 18 Feb 1796.

E, 67-68: 24 Jan 1795, Daniel Cook of Chester county, before, to John McCrory of same place, carpenter, for £30 sterling, tract granted 1 Sept 1788 to Patrick Hamilton, 300 acres on waters of Fishing Creek adj. Samuel Hamilton, and conveyed by said Patrick Hamilton to Daniel Cook 4 Aug 1790 (except 50 acres on the west side adj. lands belonging to William McCannery). Daniel Cook (own seal), Wm. John Bark, James Lockhart (own seal), William Lyle. Proved by the oath of James Lockhart 25 Jan 1796 before Hugh Whitcomb. Recorded 18 Feb 1796.

E, 68-70: 18 Jan 1796, James Mitchell and wife Nancy of Chester County to David Stephens of same, for £10 sterling, tract on the bank of Wilsons Creek, 60 acres. James Mitchell (X) (own seal), Nancy Mitchell (X) (deaf), Wm. Almer Stephens, Mary Stephens. Proved by the oath of both wts. 22 Jan 1796 before E. Nantz, J.P. Recorded 18 Feb 1796.

E, 70-71: 29 Oct 1795, William Farris of Fairfield County to Thomas Ansberrory of Chester County, for £25, 100 acres on waters of Sandy River. William Farris (deaf), Mary Farris (own seal), Wm. Edward Self, Nathaniel Henderson. "A Deed of conveyance from William Farris to Thomas Ansberrory for 100 acres originally granted to Farris by His Excellency Lord Montague 1771." Proved by the oath of Nathaniel Henderson 3 Nov 1795 before Robert Lacey, J.P. Recorded 18 Feb 1796.

E, 74-75: 8 July 1795, James McKown of Chester county to John McKown of same, for £10 sterling, 122 acres on Fishing Creek on the south side thereof, by one tract, one of 500 acres granted to Alexander McKown 22 April 1774, the other 100 acres granted to Laurence Galloway 3 Nov 1774. James McKown (own seal), Wm. Wm. Martin (X), Sampson McKown, Eliza Falloway (own seal). Proved by the oath of William Martin 20 Jan 1796 before John McKown, J.P. Plat included at the joint request of Alexander McKown here and Capt. John McKown, adj. Laurence Galloway. 10 Feb 1796. Jan Breda, D. S.

E, 75-76: Matthew Sims of York County for £20 sterling paid down to Ferdinand Hopkins, to all my part of a tract of 360 acres conveyed by David Hopkins to Nathan Sims (son of Chester County, deceased, part of 322 acres granted to David Hopkins 5 Feb 1787 on Little Sandy River and known by the place whereon Nathan Sims formerly lived, 20 Jan 1796, Matthew Sims (deaf), Wm. Wm. Hobson, Chas Sims. Proved by the oath of Chas Sims 20 Jan 1796 before Thomas Jenkins, J.P. Recorded 22 Feb 1796.

E, 76-80: 17 Feb 1792, Isaac McFadden of Chester County, planter, to Pearson William Ferguson of same, planter, for £100, 100 acres, part of tract granted 15 Aug 1772 to Robert McFadden dead, 100 acres adj. Henry Galy, Thomas Faltow, John Smith, William Taylor, Isaac McFadden (own seal), Wm. Wm. Wylie, James Ferguson. Proved by the oath of James Ferguson 17 Feb 1792 before Jas Mills, J.P. Recorded 24 Feb 1796.
