MOSELEY FAMILY NOTES

The Moseley Family Sampler on the preceding page is now in the possession of a great-granddaughter of Marcia Povall Moseley, Mrs. Marcia Elizabeth Grainger. This specimen of needlework was "wrought" by Mary Jane Elizabeth Moseley when she was twelve years old. Her own name was so long that it was "written" in needlework as Mary J. Moseley. She was named for her mother, Jane Bondurant, and her mother's two sisters, Elizabeth and Mary Anne Bondurant.

William Bondurant, grandfather of Mary J. Moseley, was the son of Dr. Joseph Bondurant and his wife, Agnes Radford, of Buckingham County. He was a grandson of Jean Pierre Bondurant one of the Huguenot settlers at Manakin.

Judith Bondurant, wife of William Bondurant, was the daughter of Robert Moseley and his wife, Magdelaine Guerrant, also of Buckingham County. She was Judith Anne Moseley.

Robert Moseley was a descendant of William Moseley of Lower Norfolk County - now Princess Anne - who came to Virginia in 1649 from Rotterdam, Holland.

Magdelaine Guerrant was the daughter of Peter Guerrant, Sr. and his wife, Magdelaine Trabue, of Cumberland County. She was the granddaughter of Daniel Guerrant and his wife, Marie L'Orange, who were settlers also at Manakin.

(Benjamin Moseley, the other grandfather named in the Sampler, was a descendant also of William Moseley. Susan Moseley, the grandmother of Mary J. Moseley, was Susannah Povall.)

The principal settlement in Virginia of the Protestant refugees from France was at Manakin, in Goochland County, and through the marriages listed above, the little twelve year old girl of the sampler had a British and Gallic heritage.

It is rather ironic that the date of the death of the little girl who recorded her family on a sampler one hundred and twenty five years ago has not been recorded or preserved in any known record.

Marcia Povall Moseley, daughter of Thomas Moseley and Jane Bondurant, married her cousin Wyatt Moseley Elliott, of Campbell County. Wyatt M. Elliott was born in Campbell County February 25, 1823, and he died in Lynchburg on February 25, 1897. He was the son of Thomas Elliott and his wife, Elizabeth M. Bondurant. Thomas Elliott was the son of Robert Elliott, Jr. and his wife, Mary Wilson, of Campbell County.

Elizabeth M. Bondurant was the sister of Jane Bondurant who married Thomas Moseley. She was the daughter of William Bondurant and Judith Anne Moseley of Buckingham County.
