Mary (daughter of Nathan and Winnefred Bryan) md Genl. Wm. Croom and had issue, (a) Hardy Bryan Croom md Frances (daughter of Col. Nathan Smith of Newbern, his family were all lost on the Steamer "Home" on the way from New York to Charleston, (b) Susan Matilda Croom md Edmund (son of Needham and Betsey Hatch Whitfield), (c) Bryan Croom md Eveline Hawks, sister of Bishop Hawks, (d) Richard Croom md Winnefred, daughter of Genl. Bryan and Winnefred Bryan Whitfield and had issue. Genl. William Croom and his 2nd wife Betsey had issue, (e) Nancy B. Croom md Dr. Edward Croom Bellamy, and had issue, (f) William Whitfield Croom md Julia Stevens daughter of Cicero Stevens, issue, (a) Bessie Croom (Kamba Thorpe authoress of "Four Oaks") md her cousin Dr. Charles Edward Bellamy, who died a surgeon in the C. S. Army, (b) Stevens Croom md Mary Marshall of Mobile, he was a lawyer of great ability, and died in Asheville, N. C., where he had gone to recruit his health, (f) John Quincy (son of Genl. William Croom and Betsey) died young, (g) Betsey Croom md Samuel Bellamy, no issue, (h) George Alexander Croom md Julia Church of Athens, Ga., issue (a) Hardy, (b) Alonza, (c) William, (d) Julia Church, (e) Bessie, (f) Annie Croom, (g and h) died young.

Edward Bryan son of the first John Bryan and Christiana, his wife settled at Swift Creek, Craven County, N. C., They were the parents of Hardy and William Bryan who intermarried with the Whitfields of Lenoir County, and whose descendants were called the New Germany Bryans, from their settling in New Germany around Newberne, embracing Jones and Craven and perhaps part of Pitt, Onslow and Carteret Counties. This settlement took its name from the settlers brought over by De Graffenreid.

Hatch, 2nd Thomas Pitts Ives, three children, (1) Mary Hatch md John T. Bryan and died without issue; (2) Anthony Hatch md Miss ——— Gardener; (3) Haskell md 1st Miss ——— Franks and 2nd a daughter of Richard Reynolds, after Thomas Bryan's death Rachel Lavender, his widow, md in 1764 Abraham Bassett Simmons, issue (a) Mary Simmons, (b) Dovey Simmons, (c) Eleanor Simmons, (d) Lavender Simmons, (e) Betty Simmons, (f) Rezin Simmons, (g) Bonets Simmons, (h) Liberty Simmons, (i) Winnefred Simmons. Rachel Lavender was the daughter of William and Rachel Reman Lavender and was born March 20th, 1737 died April 25th, 1784.

Hardy (son of Hardy and Sarah Moseley Bryan) md Sally Hatch, (daughter of Edmund Hatch) and had issue, (a) James Hardy Bryan md his cousin Lucy Hatch, (b) William Hatch Bryan md Betsy (daughter of John and Rachel Whitfield Heritage, (c) Ashe Bryan, (d) Edmund Bryan (died), (e) Thomas Bryan. After Hardy Bryan's death his widow md ——— Rountree.

3. William (son of Hardy and Sarah Moseley Bryan) md a sister of Col. Joseph Green, and had issue (a) Hardy Bonner Bryan md Mrs. Mary Swann *nee* Respass (b) Green Bryan md Nancy Blackledge, issue Wm. Green Bryan, (c) Nancy Bryan md Col. Lane and others, (e) Mary Bryan died single, (f) Susan Bryan md ——— Armstrong, then a Methodist minister, after the death of William Bryan's 1st wife Miss Green, he md Mrs. Respass and had issue. Eleanor Bryan md Thos. Wadsworth and had issue, among them Rev. Edward Wadsworth of Greensboro, Ala.

(4). Barbara (daughter of Constantine and Barbara W. Whitfield) md 1st Wm. Tooley, 2nd Richard Wooten (brother of John Wooten of Bear Creek), had issue (a) Adam Tooley by 1st marriage, (b) James Wooten, (c) Richard Wooten, (d) Wiliam Wooten, (e) Polly Darden. All moved to Alabama.

(5). Rachel Whitfield (daughter of Constantine and Barbara W. Whitfield md 1st Henry Goodman, 2nd Farquard Campbell. No issue.

(6). James Whitfield, 3rd husband of Rachel (daughter of William and Rachel Bryan Whitfield) had issue, (a) James died young; (b) John Whitfield md Mary Slade and died in 1853 of yellow fever in Mobile, Ala.

(7). John Whitfield (son of Constantine and Barbara W. Whitfield) md Jemima Haywood (sister of State Treasurer John and his brother Sherwood Haywood) and had issue, (a) Betsey Whitfield md 1st John West, 2nd John Hunter, (b) Constance Whitfield md Elizabeth (daughter of Ambrose Jones), (c) Haywood Whitfield md 1st Nancy Herring, 2nd Miss Croom, (d) Sherwood died, (e) Rachel md John Jones, (f) John Whitfield md Caroline Wright of Duplin Co., (g) Mary Whitfield md 1st Charles Hooks, 2nd William Hooks, (h) Jemima md 1st Robert Middleton, 2nd Alex Williams, (i) Keziah Whitfield md 1st Henry Moore, 2nd Jessie Croom, (j) George Whitfield never married.

Luke Whitfield (son of Constantine and Barbara W. Whitfield) md 1st Theresa Fonville and had issue, (a) Jessy, (b) James, (c) Mary, (d) Laura Whitfield who md 1st John Whitfield, 2nd Wm. Berry, 3rd ——— Pennington, one daughter by this marriage md ——— Bolling.

Theresa (daughter of Luke and Thomas Whitfield) md ——— McKoy.

Luke Whitfield md 2nd Sally Slade and had two daughters, (a) Mary md Durant Lane, (b) Winnefred md Col. James Shines of Duplin Co., N. C.

Nathan Bryan Whitfield (son of Gen'l Bryan Whitfield and Winnefred Bryan), born Sept. 19th, 1779 md Betsey Whitfield (daughter of Needham and Sally Watkins Whitfield), had issue, (1) Sarah Watkins died in infancy, (2) Winnefred died in infancy, (3) Nathan Bryan drowned when about 8 years old, (4) Mary Elizabeth died young, (5) Bryan Watkins, (6) Needham George, (7) Edith Winnefred died young, (8) Nathan Bryan, (9) James Bryan, (10) Sarah Elizabeth died young, (11) Edith James md Genl.
