OLCOTT, THOMAS, (gd.-s. of Thos., one of the orig. pprs. of Htfd.) m. Sarah (dau. of 3d Nath'l) **Footc**, 30 Nov., 1691—family (the memb. of which married into the Pitkin, Stoughton, Ely and other prominent families of E. Htfd.) is fully given in Goodwin's *Footc Geneal.*, p. 49-50. He owned lds. on The Island, 1640.

CHARLES, m. Sarah **Churchill**, 9 Aug., 1807.—*W. T. R.*

THOMAS, who owned lds. on "The Island" at Weth., 1640, was prob. of Htfd., and bro. prob. of the above Thomas.

GEORGE, "a Physician & Surgeon of Skill & respectability," d. 29 Mch., 1814, ae. 61.—*Weth. Ins.*

JOHN, of John, bp. 24 Sept., 1732, "on the mother's account," she owning the Covenant.—*Mix Rec.*

OLDHAM, JOHN, the pioneer settler of Weth.—See pp. 55-60, Vol. I.

OLMSTEAD, EDWIN, m. Mary F. **Blinn**, 9 Dec., 1824.

HENRY & Martha had *Henry*, d. 13 Apl., 1819, ae. 1 yr., 6 mo., 6 d.—*Weth. Ins.*

HENRY, of E. Htfd., m. Julia T. **Welles**, 22 Aug., 1843.—*N. C. R.*

PACKARD, JOHN, of Paris, N. Y., m. Rebecca **Woodhouse**, 27 Sept., 1808. *W. C. R.*

REBECCA, wid. of John, bp. 1 Apl., 1821; "the late John" and Rebecca had Emeline Woodhouse, and James Wright, bp. 5 May, 1821; Emeline W., d. 6 June, 1828, ae. 19.

PAGE, JEREMIAH, m. Eunice ———, who was bp. 20 June, 1802; they had (———) Martha, Fanny, Eunice, bp. 1 Aug., 1802, and Eliza, bp. 7 Oct., 1810.

PAINE, see *Payne*.

PALMER, HENRY, had a homestead in Weth., 1645 (See Chapt. VII, Vol. I); was surveyor, 1662; prob. a carpenter as he contract. to clapboard the meeting-house, in 1651.—*W. T. V., I, 39.* *Savage* says he was a freeman 1657, and living in 1663; he m. Katharine ———. (See *Savage*, III, 341.)

JOHN, (poss. a bro. of Henry), ment. by *Savage* (III, 341) freeman and carpenter at Weth., 1657; was one of the Weth. men in Maj. John Mason's troop of cavalry, Mch., 1658.

WILLIAM, the Settler, came to Plymouth, Mass., 1621, in ship *Fortune*; rec. his ld. in Weth., 1640 (See Chapt. VII, Vol. I), tho' prob. here several yrs earlier; had cattle ear-mark rec. *W. T. V., I, p. 6*; worked on meeting-house, 1648—*Ibid.*; surveyor of highways, 1657; sexton, 1658; had a son *William*. Prob. the Wm. P. whose est. was inventoried 10 Nov., 1658.

JOHN, b. 18 June, 1778; m. 9 Oct., 1800, Elizabeth **Collins**, who d. 30 Sept., 1841; he d. 15 Sept., 1849.
