But his wife Aunt Lou took the children and loved them as her own. She was indeed a mother to them.

Previous to Lizzie's death, in May 1899 she was sealed to her parents along with her brithers and sisters at the Salt Lake Temple The names of her Brothers and sisters are, Johann, Marianna, Margarethe Christian, Fritz, Rudolph, Emma, Magdalena, Rosetta, Adolph, and Peter Boss. Lizzie was known for her sweet disposition and among her associates was an peacemaker she would injure no one's feelings she would rather be wronged than hurt some one else. She was a beautiful Alto singer, and used her sweet voice to brighten many lives, among those she loved.

While her husband John Kunz was on his mission he Bapized her,
Her schooling took place at Gundliswand, she emigrated to Zion about
May 1888, she lived in Bern with Uncle Will Kunz and Family and
helped make cheese, Father returned from his mission to Nov 1886 and
on Dec 19 1888 she became his wife. she was the oth wife. The
general condition of her health was good, her eyes were brown, her
hair was auburn. Her height was 5 Ft 1 in and her weight was 125 lbs.
her chest size was 36 in. she was especially interested in the rearing
of her family and in the Gospel of Jesus Christ, for which she gave
up a home and loved ones in Switzerland. Her life was an example
for her numerous posterity to emulate.
