A lovely occasion. Suggest school was here before present students & will be here after they're gone -

Mon 27<sup>th</sup>

Spent a good part of the day shopping in Shelby & Hi-City Shopping Center. Bought a skirt & two bras. Impressed at the latter expense. Also partly paid a smock for my Foods Lab. Would've liked to buy a pair of shoes.

Got my Traveler's Chk. .019% (\$10.00) - not as much as I expected.

Rather passively listened to Resop's talk re tax.

Herman Budger brought cucumbers, tomatoes & butter beans. Shelled the latter.

Tues. 28<sup>th</sup>

Sallie had a lab test (blood sugar) and a Dr. appointment.

Cecil Goode brought us some butter beans - something like butter beans - not as good.

Took a morning trip to Shelby - pants I had in mind too expensive - not a blue & white shirt either. As I turned into the post office a man signaled I had a flat tire - was a tire place just across the street, I don't know why I didn't feel it. Leaking stem.

Watched an hour of the "Royal Wedding."

Thurs., 30<sup>th</sup>

It rained all day - nice gentle rain. Meva Smith called. They're ready for their trip to Arkansas. Hick of her to call.

Washed. Packed. Haven't finished Shogun.

Sallie went to the "hall" for dinner and with John Washburn to Lattimore tonight. She expressed gratitude for a two week vacation. She also said she'd report their finances to Wilma Hirschmann once a month.

I'm putting my suitcase in the car tonight.

Fri., 31<sup>st</sup>

To Miami

I didn't want to get up. Cool - slept under a blanket. Sallie came in to see if I had slept in. Painless trip to the airport though without the ease of time I thought I had.

Didn't know which of the Holiday Inn (3) by the airport. After four (254) phone calls I took a cab (215) and it happened to be the right

Met the mission pres. and his wife, the Regional Director and wife (J. <sup>Jim</sup>erson, he knew Lda & Pat Dalton) Sr. \_\_\_\_\_ (mission president's wife invited us to the mission home.

I had soup & flan for lunch. We joined our city tour at 3:00 pm. Drove to the Legislative Palace. Hernandez, our city guide, gave us a fine description of the two large murals on each side depicting Ecuador's history. Ecuador means equator in Spanish. Quito is 15 miles from the equator. From there we went to Colonial Quito. It started at the square - one side the cathedral, one side the President's Palace, one side the youth ~~sent~~ home & offices. Streets narrow. Houses white plaster/wash, windows & doors blue, roofs brown tile. Many people spilling out of the churches, on the square, in the street. Families were together. Many ponchos, some hats. We went into two churches: La Compania and the <sup>(St. Francis)</sup> San Franciscan (both were decorated by the Indians - mestizos). The latter completed before Compania started. San Franciscan pre-Baroque. The ceiling the ~~ceiling~~ all in gold leaf. The Madonna is depicted as having wings. To ~~San~~ <sup>Anticiclos</sup> Hill, 600' above the city - beautiful view of city and surrounding mts. We saw two snow-capped mts on our return to the city. A lovely tour.

We met our tour group at 7:30 for "drinks". Most had cake or lemonade. Each person introduced him-  
 himself. One geologist & London born wife from Canada. A Frenchman, Pierre, who can't talk (surgery induced), two elementary teachers from El Paso (have traveled the past 10 yrs. together. Inger from Pa., retired, skied all over world. A

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part of a foursome who have traveled together for four years. (Bob was left in Bogota where he was mugged, lost his passport and \$600.) A Dr. & Mrs Brown from California. Her professor of world history, she a librarian. Roger, one of the foursome from Md. (as were Ann & Bill). A couple from Los Angeles, originally from San Salvador. Anne from a ranch in Texas, Margaret from Austria & more recently Canada. I am a nice group. We had a late dinner & put on our flannel nightwear. I forgot to say we had a nice view of Ambato valley from next to Quito Hotel, which is near the U.S. Embassy & the Mission Home.

We had three different kinds of fruit (local) for dessert tonight. Can't remember the names except naranjillo.

I was proud of Helen & Gladys for leaving their testimonies.

Bernardo, our local guide, excellent. Had an un-offensive way of being proud of his country. Tangues are in season.

Mon, 3rd From Quito to Ambato & back to Quito, Ecuador. A good continental breakfast, same format as before. A late start to Ambato, south of Quito. Stopped for \$ exchange - 45 min - + our 25 min. late start put us behind - 80 miles through valleys, up to 11,000' surrounded by beautiful mountains, several snow peaked. The queen Cotacopaxi. She was stark, cloud peaked, cloud shrouded, she distanced, she dominated the scene everywhere. Family ran up the mountain side - up, way up - It was wash day. Many were washing in streams, some in plastered waist high shallow wash boxes. Scrapers were the "cost" of the day. felt hats abundant. Large cabbage. Stuccoed homes, many unfinished. Some thatched roofs. Most of the country side was green.

Ambato market was a bit of a disappointment. Helen bought a blanket, Ruth Soap & 2 small wall hanging (\$1.50). Also bought tangues twice. We had a late Ecuadorian dinner. Entrée, corn on cobs and cheese and hot sauce. A patito & cheese

We were fortunate to have a sunny day. Lima is usually fog/smog/hazy 8mo/yr.

The architecture of bldg. around the squares is impressive.

We hung onto our purses like crazy as we went to a fish restaurant. I had a delicious sauce, slightly hot, fish with a mixture of rice & corn. Delicious.

Helen wasn't well this A.M. Woke up a little after 4:00 AM to become aware of it. (Very congested) Seemed to feel better by the end of the day.

Potato chips are sold with nuts, banana chips & lupine nuts (as the flower) by 100gms. I was going to buy in a dept store but the clerk was out for lunch!

On our city tour we saw some lovely Spanish Renaissance windows broad, flat roofed generally.

where the grass in parks had not been watered very dry. Many people using them.

On the city tour we went inside of home (now used for offices) - the courtyard balcony held up without pillars. Beautiful jalousie wood balconies. Had its own chapel.

Weather: sweater.

Babu, who was mugged in Bogotá is with us.

5th Wed So Cuzco (11,000') from Lima, Peru

Up at 4:30. Breakfast on freshly squeezed orange juice at 5:00 - enroute ~~to~~ Faucett, Peruvian, privately owned line. Snacks enroute - wrote in jnl.

Cuzco in relatively narrow valley. Many adobe homes, streets narrow, hotel charming with wall hangings of Inca motif and bright wool bedspreads. A short rest, my breathing a little shallow. On a shopping trip to two factories. I bought an alpaca rug for Wilma.

Developed a terrible headache as our Cuzco tour got underway. We visited 3 Inca ruins, saw llama, many huts/houses of crude mud/straw adobe. Mountains are beautiful, Cuzco picturesque. By the time we got back to the hotel my headache was intense - to bed. High altitude

6th Thurs Cuzco to Machu Picchu, Peru

By 2:30 AM my head was still aching - two Spleenol & two more hours sleep. Relief. Continental breakfast &

As we started shopping we ran into a group of demonstrators, a whole party. I went toward up the bus.



Caught an early morning train. A spectacular ride - 3 1/2 hrs - sheer cliffs, much of the way via a rushing river, in spots almost to rapids strength. Through the jungles, beautiful peaks, and eventually to the train station. From a bus, after a wait, to Machu Picchu, narrow roads, switching back and forth. An exciting (scary?) ride of 20 min.

We had our lunch on arrival at the hotel. The mtn. peaks playing peek a boo with the clouds, up 12000' feet. Met two missionary enroute home from Chile.

Walked up a part of the ruins - cloudy, cloudy - eventually rained. A magnificent place. Bigger than the pictures make it seem. One little camera could not capture its magnitude. Rained & we got drenched. We stood way up - not highest points, but we could see across each side - felt literally "on top of the world".

We waited in the rain to go back on the bus. Met two more missionaries - has been fun seeing them.

A long train ride back, much of it in the dark. We have a jovial group. We were a little chilled by our soaking - my coat wet - hat also - Fortunately the rain didn't go through my coat. Just dripped down my neck & my shoes were wet.

Home (hotel) by nine and a fire in the fireplace. Warm showers. Jnl. caught up & early to bed.

Tue, 7<sup>th</sup>

Cuzco to Lima

By a mistaken morning call we were up an hour too soon. Breakfast, through continental, is very adequate. Inevitable trip back to Lima. Felt like returning "home".

Walked with Gladys, Ruth & Helen on Union St. Lunched at a "tea house". Helen & I on to Sears where she got her suitcase and record & cleaner (for jacket). Back by 1:00pm & light us went to EPPA by taxi ("2.50/person") where the driver waited & then took us to the "U" shaped Indian shops. I bought some Peruvian Christmas decorations at EPPA and a "mapa" (carved wood) at the latter. Gladys & I went to the P.O. for stamps.

As the rains came some we were soaked on by clouds



Stopped by a book store where we brooded over a perfectly gorgeous book of Peru. \$75. Left & walked a block toward the hotel when Gladys stopped, "If they'll take Visa I'm going to buy that book." They did, she did.

Bought some lovely Machupicchu cards. Wrote one to Nava & family (for Buzza a stamp) & Vivian Holmson.

After shopping am pleased with Wil's msg. ~~Over~~ at the Indian shops looked mangy - Washed. Repacked.

Bought a lady weaving for Mary Miles. Will be a challenge to carry in the remaining five countries.

We went to the Carillon Hotel for a lovely dinner (pisco Sour - for those who wanted it - palm salad (delicious) steaks, potato croquette, zucchini(?), dried carrots and a choice from the dessert cart (wrong choice) choc. cake too generously laced with rum. A delightful show which gave meaning to the bits (brittle & flared stiff drum) the woven balls of which I'd like to get one. There was folk dancing by three couples and several other dances with a change of costume each time, a male and two women vocalists. A band of local instruments, large bowed instrument and the *sal*, and *horns*, an excellent rectangular drum? played by a *coole*. Had adjust sounds by tilting it as he pounded out the rhythm - also sat on it as he beat.

Surroundings were nice - everywhere fresh flowers. Also on top floor, glassed windows. Even in 'hamboldt' smog city looked pretty.

Four million people in Lima.

A protest march last night before we went to dinner.

Sat, 8<sup>th</sup> Lima, Peru to La Paz, Bolivia (an hr. time change)

A pleasant night, a gray Lima day, pants & shirt didn't dry. Washed hair, missing the hair dryer. Breakfast & then a tour to the

Pachacamac pre-Inca ruins about 20 miles out on the Pan-American Highway - huge sand dunes, interesting ground.

Finished Shopping  
 Read Miles  
 Mchur, Niche & Curcio of Lima Barbells.



Called Joe & Angela's mother.  
Thanks to Gladys she could see a medical check.  
not home.

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Is still under excavation. We climbed to the top where we overlooked the sea, two islands and where the river ran fertile fields & gardens. Slums on the other side. There were only five of us on the tour. From the ruins (where we visited a small museum) we went to the Archaeological Museum. The pottery & textiles were outstanding. Dioramas of several ruins & a last one of Machu Picchu even larger in scope than I felt while there. Another interesting display of fetal positioned mummies. One showing part of the 41 beautifully embroidered pieces of fabric which layed on particular one. We returned to the hotel at 2:00 pm too late to go to our authentic Peruvian restaurant. Quick snacks in the hotel - charged for salsa & butter we ate with our soup plus tax and service charge. Gladys & Peter left to get a tape & record. We left our rooms around 3:00 pm for a wait in the hotel lobby for our pickup to the airport.

Summary re Lima: gray skies, wide blvds, charming squares with French style steps, narrow side balconies, many beautiful Spanish style homes. Many slums - gardens on the side of the street. Luján. Sol (230/US\$), Bequienvillea, Tanginora.

8<sup>th</sup> the airport, saw the 2 edders we'd seen at ~~San~~ Machu Picchu. Quiet, Perina (was hungry) en route to La Paz. Plane practically empty. Landing was bouncy (because of thin air) cold. Easy time through customs - airport about 12,500' - La Paz a little lower - as if it's in a soup bowl - the <sup>local</sup> guide, Felicia, had us close our eyes & count to 30 together - then open them and there was La Paz, ablaze beneath us. The beds were good and we were soon warm. We lay in bed & watched the lights of homes on the main side for a few minutes before going to sleep. La Paz is interesting in that the better homes are low - poorer on the top.

9<sup>th</sup>, Sun La Paz - "altano" area

up at 6:00 pm - waitress ready for us for breakfast but we enjoyed the view of the city from the 15<sup>th</sup> floor coffee shop. Ruth has a high altitude headache.



9 Aug 1981 (cont)

We left for our "min" (Siñuanacu) dressed as warmly as I could say layers counting lingerie. As we traveled we saw the colorfully dressed, many pelleted women with felt bowler hats, many with babies strapped on their backs with colorful handwoven blankets or shawls. The paved road didn't last long and we were soon on a "bone breaking" (one tear back) road - the mtns glorious - terraced farming, houses of adobe of mud and straw, dry grass which is often used in thatching everyone - The driver's assistant (?) put a wire up of the windshield to protect it from rocks. Passed through many narrow streets, small towns - a church a part of the square.

Interested at Siñuanacu with the possible theory of men/people coming from outer space to help them build their bldgs, temple. The Peruvian govt only allows their own genealogist to dig. Many parts look as if they need attention. Peru may be too involved with civil affairs. (They just settled a revolution the day we arrived.)

On to Surigui where we rode the hydrofoil on Lake Titicaca (largest navigable lake at altitude of 12,500') Stopped at the island Surigui - Pabo? - where the Aymara Indians live and where they make red ~~clay~~ (Thor Heyerdahl had his Pa-II built there). We were met by menature ones. They are interesting - double deckers. We saw a man making one & went on further to the school with a statue of the young man who accompanied Heyerdahl. People were selling some woven things. From there we went to Puatayata for lunch. We were hungry. A few course one with a salad entree, soup - with potatoes (Peru grows 200 variations) and a thin pasta looking snipped out little circle. Learned later it is a native cereal. Steak with a fried - poached? - egg on top, mashed potatoes & diced carrots. Orange for dessert. Nearby the restaurant we ate in was a pen of llamas and alpacas. Roger - was feeding one and it spit right in his face.

An hour and half ride back to La Paz along side famous snow covered mtns, several over 50,000'. Bought some post cards. No stamps available. Caught up several. Helen has made several attempts to get the mission home. She has some popcorn to deliver.



Gladys & Ruth couldn't go to "their" school - the one their PTA had funded - because the man who was the intermediary hasn't been able to contact them because of the revolution. They aren't meeting him tonight.

I went with Helen, via colectivo, to the mission home office. Were met by some young girls, one of whom spoke English. Got the missionaries, they came, Gabuella's father came (he kissed our hand in greeting!) via car, one of the missionaries drove, dropped him off, took us to the mission home (in an exclusive residential area.) The Maestros Home large, no central heating. En route to the mission home we saw one of the newer wards. (The one which meets where the mission offices are.) They seemed pleased over Helen's care package.

There were fireworks. (I thought they were gas when I first heard them.) Celebrating their 2<sup>nd</sup> Aug Independence but because of the revolution? change of government the day we came. They hadn't celebrated before. Scared several in the town.

Summary Bolivia: La Paz in the bottom of a bowl, sides mtns. Dangerous Andes snow covered. Altiplano (plateau region) and the brown grass stacks under a blue sky. Dressed women in many pollerols, bright shawls with baby on back. The snug fitting caps, flaps on the ears, the haunting melody of the flute (horn?). Snow as we left the airport in La Paz. Cloud shrouded mtns. Freshly squeezed orange juice. Helpful Gabuella, 16, who speaks five languages. People: beasts of burden

### 10, Mon Leaving La Paz, Bolivia for Santiago, Chile

We did a city tour - out side of La Paz to the Valley of the Moons (similar to badlands of <sup>North</sup> South Dakota), saw some of the same residential area of La Paz as when we went to the mission home. Also a cacti garden en route to the Valley of the Moons. Went to the market. Saw hundred varieties of potatoes. Saw the curifa & kiviya dried and frozen ones Sister Maestros gave me. Was snowing and dusky. Cold. Lots of dried corn - many varieties, some very large kernels. The ladies were bundled up. At 2 o'clock church where we saw people, ladies in black embroidered shawls, men also in black offering condolemas after a

Lunch enroute. Hungry.

~~11<sup>th</sup>~~ Met by our local guide, a German transplant  
our oldest local guide. Got through customs efficient.  
Loy. Perry said "We're back in civilization". Civilization  
is expensive! Hotel service in <sup>the</sup> restaurant is 20075 tax,  
2000 service charge! A nap. Helen, Gladys, the couple  
from San Salvador and I went with our guide to the  
Florencio Show & dinner. Jose & Margarita told us of  
"knowing a Mormon". The dinner was good; fresh salad,  
roast pork & fruit for dessert. The most fun was  
seeing the local Chilean people dancing, dancing beautifully  
and if they were enjoying it immensely. Floor show nothing  
to compare with the one at the Carrillon in Lima. Even  
so it was enjoyable. Had a tour of the city enroute  
Lima is split pretty well into two sections the old (Colon-  
ial) and the new.

Tues, 11<sup>th</sup>

A tour of the new part of the city. On Cristobal  
Hill, a pretty, clean city. Pride re. A yellowish-line  
tree in bloom - it's still winter - manosa (different  
from N.C. variety) after 10 yrs. of Aliente seemingly great  
improvement in their economy.

Enroute to Vina del Mar and Valparaiso through  
3 ranges of mtns, the country, beautiful almond trees  
flowering, some other fruit trees beginning to bloom.  
Vina del Mar "Chilean Miami", nice shore line. Saw  
an L.D.D. church & at the post office two elders -  
A most pleasant ride. Lunch & supper in our room.

Santiago has no private vehicles out from 2-5 pm.  
Too coarse energy & reduce exhaust fumes. The city is  
smoggy. Bill Wood(?) said he didn't see the mtns  
in the 20 months he was here in the 1960's. We  
could see them quite well. "Things" are expensive here  
compared to Balboa, Peru & Ecuador. We had some  
pastries enroute to Vina del Mar. Too sweet. Bought  
some fruit and ate in our room with "Bavel" air-  
line cheese & rolls. Ruth joined us (Gladys, Helen & I).

Wed, 12<sup>th</sup>

Santiago to Puerto Montt, Chile

Sevenish breakfast. On an "old" city tour prior to leaving



for the airport.

Summary of Chile, Santiago: More efficiency at the airport customs - 5 stations rather than the usual one or two. New & old parts of city rather sharply defined, clean, many parks. Subway. The Avenida from San Cristobal Hill. The dancing of the Chileans when we went out to dinner. Govt. fund recipients must work 4 hrs/day - work in parks public "works". # The mountains and light, light lavender of the almond trees ~~route~~ to Valparaiso.

The plane ride to Puerto Montt was breathtakingly beautiful - continual snow covered Andes - many pointed, not a few miles but all the 1 1/2 hr. flight. Some lovely views d'oeuvre on the plane. Ten miles from the airport to our old but character laden hotel which overlooks the water & the park. We have a sitting room! And a wardrobe, and a balcony. Lunch - 4 courses awaited us. Walked, walked browsing the stores - doesn't seem like a city of over 100,000 people. Bought a pair of knee socks. Helen bought her son, Riley, a sweater at the market. Got a bus back to the hotel when it started to rain.

We are 1500 miles from the southern tip of Chile & the last "land" city, the rest is islands & fjords. 42° latitude as far south of the equator as Oregon is north of the equator.

We have dinner at 7:30 - lots of food today, though we don't really need the food it's fun to see food served well: four courses, with service plate.

Thurs, 13<sup>th</sup>

From Puerto Montt, Chile to Bariloche, Argentina. Trip on the docks, rain, Bus, then boat, bus, then boat, bus, boat, bus. Too cloudy & rainy to see the volcanos, Osorno & —. Saw a beautiful waterfall, gushing over rocks in five or six places - we walked amid them, over rocks. Many private smaller. Snow at the summit between Chile & Argentina. Kree hi Serbia felt good. Justly, rough road between Chile & Argentina. Met students when Chile officials checked our bags - passport. They were anxious to talk English. We arrived in Bariloche cold & weary. A sandwich, chocolate and to bed.



Ex. 14<sup>th</sup> Bañoche to Buenos Aires, Argentina  
 I really slept - under three blankets. Breakfast  
 and a tour of Bañoche - back to our disembarkation  
 point. Rode a chair lift to needle(?) Point, beautiful  
 lookout, wind like a knife. Truly a beautiful  
 lake country.

To the airport for a long wait. Light lunch  
 enroute of a plane seemingly filled with tourists.

Buenos Aires a city of 12 million. Two airports. We  
 looked as if we were landing in the river. Warmer  
 I have a cold.

After our "welcome drinks", several are non-alco-  
 holic. A good fruit punch heavily laced with grape-  
 fruit juice. The Browns (Beth & Miles) Helen, Philip  
 & I walked along Florida St., pedestrian shopping -  
 lots of people, on to Lavalle St. for a steak dinner  
 at La Palaco de la Papa Frita (another pedestrian street)  
 which included steak, good puffed up fried potatoes,  
 a salad, rolls, breadsticks, baked potatoes, carrots,

 music type, Friday night strollers? Walked over

Sat. 15<sup>th</sup>

Buenos Aires - lovely day.

Washed hair to discover my two small bottles of Breda  
 are hair conditioner rather than shampoo! Washed in soap.  
 Laundry done. Shopped 'n' shopped. I didn't buy anything.  
 Some beautiful leather goods. Lunched in coffee shop. No  
 service charge or tax.

A city tour - didn't feel I saw too much - saw  
 many squares statues, Bldg. - old ones - French style.  
 Went to the Bacca(?) area, Italian, and quite pictures-  
 que - arty? Drove along the river - wide - 20  
 a fruit market. Kilo of tangerines for 28¢ - about 9.

To Papa Fritas again for dinner. Still couldn't eat  
 all my steak. Could've eaten more salad.

Sorry I didn't get Clive Pope a leather (for  
 roping calves). He would've enjoyed one.

Buenos Aires: Big, lovely shops. Gung, he never  
 fans. Lovely eat of goat, not used because wrong kind  
 of meat. Lovely French homes. Wide streets. People in parks

Sun. 16<sup>th</sup> From Buenos Aires to Asuncion, Paraguay

Tried to find a place to go to church, distance & time discouraged. Helen & I took a map. My cold is still at an early stage. About an hr. drive to the airport - an hours wait & an hr & a half to Asuncion. Modern airport - a lovely fragrant flowering tree in bloom - many had shed a basket of flowers. City of about half a million. Lovely tiled roof homes.

I've eaten about six-seven tangines.

Our hotel is "out" - interesting lights - not very good for seeing - Have samples of the --- lace featured in hotel.

To a dinner show. Quite a variety of musicians and singers. In the bottle dance(?) one girl danced with six wine bottles stacked on her head.

Mon, 17<sup>th</sup> Asuncion to Itaipu Falls, Brazil.

A city tour which was really a shopping tour. Bought several lace doilies, basket cloths & a little wall hanging. Interesting conversation with one of the guides. Madeleine, married to a man from Paraguay, she from South Africa. Spoke of the "Paraguayan mentality" - the role of a woman ("have babies by the million, stay home", the macho man with any number of women - a no-no for women). Interesting. Asuncion is on the Paraguay river. Lovely Jacaranda (jacaranda) trees. Lunch (with Henry cooking - Jacqueline). Another plane ride. A quick walk to the Falls as dark overlook us. Ruth has a bad cold.

Tues, 18<sup>th</sup>

A thick fog. A big spread for breakfast: watermelon, honey dew, papaya, cheese, cold cuts, orange, pineapple - watermelon best bet. The falls in a national park. We walked the same walk, only further, of the previous night. Elevator & two row boats. The fog lifted and as we stood on the edge of Devil's Throat the sun was out, a rainbow in all its glory with a reflection of another. Rode the bus back to the hotel & walked back to the front of Devil's Throat - was perspiring on my return.

Our flight was canceled - 6 hrs. in the airport - To Sao Paulo by 10:30. Big city, 10 million. Our room cold.



Wed, 19<sup>th</sup>

São Paulo to Rio de Janeiro, Brazil

Some of the good juice for breakfast. Called the temple, closed. We took an hour of the city tour and thanks to our local guide got a taxi to the temple. Workmen let us in. Taxi waited. A ward/stake center by the temple. Mission office(?) and apartments on same block. Hibiscus, agave and many lovely flowers in bloom on the temple grounds. In back of the temple some beautiful soft leaf lettuce! Cold was<sup>th</sup> for all of us. Well worth it/person.

São Paulo from our 15<sup>th</sup> story hotel room looks like a busy city. At least over in bloom in profusion (early according to the guide). Javis run on alcohol; ~~Some~~ most other vehicles on gasohol. Gas is 79¢/liter, about twice as much as in Hawaii.

On our arrival at the hotel last night we had a basket of fruit on our table. A lovely gesture.

To Rio, 55 min flight, weather warm. The city does have a gorgeous setting. Wind still cool. Airport is open as Hawaii. Cold "out" - remedied from shops, etc. Gladys & I are now sharing a room. Ruth & Helen seemed quite amenable. An early dinner in the coffee shop. Not cheap! Have drunk Lelikei juice since Squaw Falls - last night it was<sup>th</sup> 1.8¢/glass. Gladys talked about her family last night. We do feel freer with each other. My

Thurs 20<sup>th</sup>

Rio de Janeiro, Brazil (Intercontinental Hotel)

Our hotel room has a balcony & looks out over the beach. My tummy/bowels rebelling over something. Big spread for breakfast. Date messy. Bus tour to Sugar Loaf mtn. Clouds & rain cleared up about Copacabana beach - passed Spanoma beach. Lots of beautiful beach on R/W. As we went up Sugar Loaf via 2 different cable cars - one took us to one level, another to the top. About 1400 feet. View spectacular. As we were ready to leave a cloud rolled in and it poured rain. Through downtown, by downtown airport where we arrived. D.H. Sterns for a look at their store polishing, designing, etc. Drove to a club - to see jewelry - beautifully set - recd our charm bracelets and five stones. Stopped and took smaller ones — vans — to the base of the 175 statue — 750 steps up — numerous landings, a shop on each — lush vegetation — clouds came and went. Beautiful view of the surrounding area. Silvery trees interspersed on the mtn. side which looked as if they had white blooms. The lapacho trees are almost leafed over here. The day, ocean is beautiful. Beaches full of bronzed skinned people. Valley <sup>beach</sup> ocean games being played with a vengeance. Kites dancing in the sky. Hang gliders in abundance. Back to the hotel, relaxed until departure. All a little excited.
